The Rocky Mountaineer

Vancouver to Banff or Calgary

Kicking Horse Route

Named for the pass over which it crosses the Canadian Rockies, the Kicking Horse Route takes you between Vancouver, British Columbia, and either Banff or Calgary, Alberta. This route traces the historic transcontinental rail line that united Canada's East and West.

Day 1 Vancouver to Kamloops

At Rocky Mountaineer Vancouver Station, board the world-renowned Rocky Mountaineer train. Pass through the fertile fields of the Fraser Valley and view the towering peaks of the Coast Mountains before entering the Fraser Canyon. See the thundering waters of Hell's Gate and follow the Thompson River to historic Kamloops, gateway to the Interior of British Columbia. Overnight in comfortable accommodations in Kamloops.

Day 2 Kamloops to Banff or Calgary

Continue east through the vast ranchlands along the South Thompson River, pass Craigellachie where the "Last Spike" of the Canadian Pacific Railway was driven, and enter Rogers Pass, with its tunnels, snowsheds and glistening glaciers. Climb through the Spiral Tunnels and over the Continental Divide to Banff National Park. End your rail journey in Banff or continue on to the "Stampede City" of Calgary.

Vancouver to Jasper

Yellowhead Route

Journey between Vancouver, British Columbia, and the picturesque resort town of Jasper, Alberta, along the Yellowhead Route, named for a second pass through the Canadian Rockies. This route is known for scenic valleys and opportunities to spot wildlife, including bears.

Day 1 Vancouver to Kamloops

At Rocky Mountaineer Vancouver Station, board the world-renowned Rocky Mountaineer train. Pass through the fertile fields of the Fraser Valley and view the towering peaks of the Coast Mountains before entering the Fraser Canyon. See the thundering waters of Hell's Gate and follow the Thompson River to historic Kamloops, gateway to the Interior of British Columbia. Overnight in comfortable accommodations in Kamloops.

Day 2 Kamloops to Jasper

Rejoin the Rocky Mountaineer and follow the Thompson River through rolling plateaus into the snowy peaks of the Monashee Mountains. View Pyramid Falls and the expansive glaciers of the Alberta Icefields before passing by Mount Robson, which at 3,954 metres (12,972 feet), is the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies. In late afternoon, arrive in Jasper, located in the largest mountain park in Canada.

Fraser Discovery Route

Our new Fraser Discovery Route, named for the mighty Fraser River whose length it follows, links the mountain resorts of Whistler, British Columbia, and Jasper, Alberta, and travels through the historic gold-rush Cariboo region and the lush forests of northern British Columbia.

Day 1 Whistler to Quesnel

Board the world-famous Rocky Mountaineer train for a two-day journey on our exciting new route. Enjoy breathtaking and varied scenery, including the winding lakeshores of Anderson and Seton lakes, the desert-like conditions of the Fraser Canyon and the vast ranchlands of the Cariboo Plateau. Your day concludes as the Rocky Mountaineer follows the banks of the Fraser River into Quesnel. Overnight in comfortable accommodations in Quesnel.

Day 2 Quesnel to Jasper

Continue eastward through the forests of northern British Columbia, home to plentiful wildlife, including a large population of moose. Enter the Rocky Mountain Trench, where the Rocky Mountains rise steeply to the north and the Cariboo Mountains soar to the south. Pass Mount Robson, the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies at 3,954 metres (12,972 feet), before arriving in Jasper in the early evening.
